Require Passenger Seatbelt Warnings



10,000 pounds or less. The goal is to increase seat belt usage, as it is one of the most effective ways to prevent injuries and fatalities in accidents, with nearly 43,000 people losing their lives on U.S. roads in 2021, half of whom were unbelted. The proposed rule outlines specific requirements for rear and front seats, including visual and audible warnings when seat belts are not fastened. NHTSA estimates that these requirements could prevent approximately 300 non-fatal injuries and over 100 fatalities annually. Rear seat belt usage rates have consistently lagged behind those of front seat



Negligence refers to the failure to exercise reasonable care, leading to harm or injury to another person. It serves as the foundation for determining liability in accidents and injuries. At the center of negligence is the concept of a "duty of care." This duty represents a legal obligation to act with reasonable caution to prevent harm to others. For instance, a driver on the road has a duty of care to operate their vehicle safely and responsibly, ensuring the safety of themselves and others. Proving negligence involves demonstrating that this duty of care was breached. This breach means that the responsible party did not act in a manner that a reasonable person would under similar circumstances. For example, a driver who was texting while driving might be considered to have breached their duty of


Featured Recipe: Salted Caramel

Chocolate Pecan Cookies

½ teaspoon salt 2 large eggs, lightly beaten 3/4 cup chopped toasted pecans 44 caramel candies 6 tablespoons heavy whipping cream

coarse sea salt 1 (6 ounce) bag semisweet chocolate chips 1 tablespoon vegetable oil

Directions: Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Line 3 to 4 baking sheets with parchment paper. Press dough together in plastic wrap; roll dough into 1 1/2-inch balls.
